D uring the period of lockdown church buildings have been closed along with many other public buildings where people gather. Christians and indeed people of all faiths or none who are used to meeting together in one place, have had to adapt in order to keep in touch.

Much as we love our places of worship and the sense of constancy they bring us in an ever changing world, the 'Church' is essentially the people. Some of the Methodist congregation

have been meeting on Zoom for worship and I know similar things are happening with folks from St Mary's and Life Church.

Hardly anyone had heard of Zoom back at the beginning of March and now it seems that all generations are getting in on the act—keeping in touch with family and friends during this time of separation. The covid-19 crisis has brought about countrywide acts of kindness and a renewed sense of community in many places. In a village that already has a great community spirit, helping neighbours is perhaps more the norm and long may this continue.

I have joined a couple of the Harlington Facebook groups to give me a view of village life today, as well as reminisce about the past. The Queen's Silver Jubilee in 1977 stands out in my mind. Just as I write, the announcement has been made that churches can open their doors on a limited basis for private prayer. Methodist Church Connexion has produced detailed guidelines on the re-opening of its buildings in due course, which involves completing satisfactory risk assessments and putting in place the correct hygiene protocols to protect everyone who enters our buildings. (That's enough of the boring bits)! We do, however, look forward to opening the Chapel doors once again for worship and community use when it is safe to do so.

Fran Plank - a HUGE Thank you plus WI

When I came to the village 43 years ago, Contact was a duplicated magazine sold and distributed to the minority of the village. Some years later a decision was taken to change the model, to circulate it as a free magazine to the whole village and to cover the cost with money from the churches, Harlington Parish Council and adverts. One big change that happens when you do this is that you have many more copies to distribute. We started to use a commercial printer and someone was needed to be there when the copies were delivered.

Fran "at the Post Office" took on the role of Distribution Manager. She received the copies from the printer, counted them out for each of the distributors and delivered them to those distributors, making sure that rounds were covered for holidays, illness etc, and generally ensuring, so long as the editor got the copy to the printer on time, that Contact would be out for the beginning of each month.

This has **never** been an easy task. A thousand plus copies of a magazine is not a small or light bundle, but over the years Fran has done this faithfully, come rain, shine or car thefts.

However, all good things must come to an end. Covid-19 has made things particularly difficult, as many distributors are unable to deliver, rounds have had to be revised and Fran herself was isolating. She has therefore decided to retire

from the role. The Contact team want to thank her for everything she has done over all the years. In other times we would aim for a presentation at some event – but this 'Thank You' will have to suffice until we can all get together again.



Linda Horn, the Acting Chairperson of Flittabus has contacted us on behalf of their committee as they are now thinking about when and how they might be able to resume any services. As you may know, all the drivers are volunteers, and Flittabus exists purely to provide transport for the community. There is, as yet, no date for starting the service again, or any decisions made on whether all of the scheduled services will resume exactly as before right from the start.

Harlington Hedgehogs plus 0-4 Club



Over the last month, there has been an increase in the number of hedgehog sightings in the village. One resident has reported around five visiting just their garden, ranging from large adult hedgehogs to young ones. This means our village is providing a great environment year on year for hedgehogs to thrive and along with the additional food and water being put out, this

will continue to help our hedgehog population.

As we are all staying at home, you may be using your gardens more for activities such as football, badminton etc as well as building/DIY projects where you may be putting in a pond, upgrading your garden fences etc. Please keep in mind hedgehogs and other wildlife when carrying out sports or DIY activities in your gardens. Take any nets in at the end of the day so hedgehogs will not get tangled, make sure there is a way in/out of your garden if you have a new fence, ensure there is a way out of a pond – although hedgehogs are great swimmers, they need to have a way out should they fall in. Make sure any holes from posts are blocked up so a hedgehog won't fall in. These are just a few examples of where hedgehogs may run into problems as they have a great sense of smell but terrible eye sight.

Enjoy the lovely weather enabling you to stay outside later in the evening and hopefully therefore capturing a glimpse of your hedgehog visitors – they are so interesting to watch.



Flit Vale - Wildlife Trust Local group



Bedfordshire Cambridgeshire Northamptonshire



It was with sadness that our group had to cancel our programme of talks and walks planned so far this year. Running events and maintaining social distancing rules has just made it too difficult. We will of course keep you informed if the situation changes.

Our committee has been keeping in touch with one another and most of us have been out and about, noting the wildlife on our local patches. I expect many of you have been doing the same.

Personally, I have been following the progression of flowers in the hedgerows and verges when I go out running and cycling from Pulloxhill. The dominant colour for the last two months has been white mainly due to the umbelliferous species filling the ditches. These include frothy cow parsley, the more stately umbels of hog weed and towering above 'forests' of the infamously poisonous hemlock (look for reddish-purple blotches on the tall hollow stems).

There are splashes of colour such as the scarlet of poppies, purple of wild geranium and common mallow, red campion, blue of speedwells and green alkanet and yellows of buttercups, dandelion-like species and spring cinquefoil. Great swathes of ox-eye daisy along verges. Scented elderflower came early in the hedgerow at the end of May so my annual cordial is already bottled. If you can get out on the local chalk down lands, there are large numbers of orchid species around at the moment.

Last month we started sending out an e-newsletter to those who are on our emailing list. If you would like to received a monthly copy, then let us know (flitvale.info@gmail.com). We are very happy to receive comments and photos about local sightings to include in future issues
