

## Letter from Revs. Nigel and Linda, St. Mary's

Dear Friends,

You will recall that 17 months ago the British government ordered us to avoid pubs, restaurants and non-essential travel. That very morning, Sutton Seeds, in Paignton, Devon, thought that they were having problems with their computer because it was registering sales figures for seeds that had grown by more than 100 per cent. But what was happening was that suddenly the nation had taken to cultivating their gardens.

What sparked this renewed interest in growing plants and when, I wondered, did we, as a nation, first become gardeners? It prompted me to do a bit of research.

Was there a wartime mood in the country? After all, it was during the two Great wars of the last century that we saw a marked increase in cultivating the land. In the First World War the number



of allotments grew from 600,000 to 1,500,000. And during World War II there was the famous 'Dig for Victory' campaign.

This country's interest in gardening went back much further than the wars. Curiously, historians trace the beginnings of the English cottage garden back to a previous pandemic, the Black Death.

But how did this devastating event lead to a growth in home gardening? Well, as much of the peasantry was killed, those who remained had more bargaining power than before. These formerly landless peasants now became free cottagers. And they made sensible use of their extra land by cultivating them into gardens, and so began the tradition of growing one's own plants for food and decoration.

It seems that there are always at least two possible ways to respond to a crisis. Some might be tempted to panic, withdraw, lose hope or even give up; others, on the other hand, see the importance of having a focus, setting themselves new challenges, like gardening, and refusing to give up. In a word they are people who have a vision.

One person we read about in the Bible who always strikes me as a visionary is David. Vision has been defined as a combination of 'a deep dissatisfaction with what is and a clear grasp of what could be'. If we have a vision, we will always

flourish; we will always believe there is more to look forward to.

David says: "I am like an olive tree flourishing in the house of God". David lived much closer to nature than many of us today. Although a shepherd, he would have wondered at the small miracle of sowing a seed and seeing a spear of green life shoot up from the soil. He would have known something of the experience described by Francis Bacon who, in 1625, wrote that to plant a garden is the "greatest refreshment of the spirit of man". No wonder David sees himself as an olive tree that flourishes, because it's established in the place offering the perfect conditions for protection and growth: in the very house of God.

It is good that people have returned to their gardens; it has given them something to look forward to. In fact, a recent study conducted by the Royal Horticultural Society confirmed that gardening is good for you. The report says that daily gardening has as big an impact on wellbeing as has regular cycling or running. It leads to greater energy and lower stress, and eases episodes of depression ... and that's because the sights and sounds of the outdoors provide a distraction, making it easier to keep going.

So even as the promise of normal life draws nearer, I won't be putting the rake and hoe back in the shed. For the greatest restoration of our souls no research beats what David discovered, many years ago, that to go on thriving we must trust in God's unfailing love, praise Him for all He has done and continue to hope in His name. Then we too will be like a flourishing olive tree in the House of the Lord.
