

Book Sale *plus* **Hedgehogs**

I am now regularly being asked if we are going to hold the Book Sale this year. I would love to be able to answer "Yes", but I don't think that I can at present.

The reasons for this are:

As anyone who has been knows, the book sale is a crowded event. We believe that we still need to keep events COVID secure, practically impossible at the book sale.

Reports and possibilities of a firebreak lockdown are still around, and with rising hospital numbers have to be a possibility. Unfortunately we can't just delay the book sale if this happens, particularly if we have already collected a lot of books.

If we can work out a way, we will hold a smaller sale, probably in the Spring. Clive

Hedgehogs

We have all noticed a little drop in temperature as we are now heading into the autumn season and so looking out for smaller hedgehogs is important. The smaller ones may be late hoglets and may find it difficult to put on the required weight before hibernation. Keep putting food (meaty/biscuit cat or dog food – not fish flavoured) and plenty of water. This will help the smaller hogs gain the weight they need over the next few months. If you are not able to put out extra food, another way you can help is by having a messy area of your garden. This will encourage natural food for the hedgehogs. You can also build a small log

pile with an entrance where a hedgehog may take up residence in preparation for hibernating (a wooden box or pet carrier would work just as well!). There is still plenty of time over the next few months for hedgehogs to gain weight and find a home but we can all help them with these small extras. Keep watching the hedgehogs over the coming months in preparation for when the colder weather starts, so you will know if you have any particularly small hedgehogs which may need rescuing when we get the first hard frosts.




