

Letter from Rev. Nina Johnson, Methodist Minister

What is your favourite Christmas song?.. Listening to the radio in the car last week (the second week of November) for one listener it was Mariah Carey's *All I want for Christmas*, the playing of which would have been part of her reward along with kicking off the Christmas songs had she successfully answered 5 Christmas questions in 30 seconds – she got the third question wrong so there were no Christmas songs for that day!

But what about a favourite Christmas carol? Might it be *Away in a manger* – a popular choice for children's nativities, *or Silent Night* or *O come all ye faithful* or maybe another of the many that could be chosen?

I have to confess that by the time I get to Christmas Day I have usually reached Christmas carol saturation point and am longing for something different.

My favourite carol is not one of the most well known. If you have attended a carol service that I have led you may have sung it. It is set to the traditional tune for the song *Scarlet Ribbons*. A hymn written by John L Bell and Graham Maule. It begins with the words *Who would think that what was needed to transform and save the earth might not be a plan or army, proud in purpose proved in worth? Who would think, despite derision, that a child might lead the way?...*



The hymn expresses the way in which God surprises earth with heaven. For me it links with the idea that the ways of God are not those of power and force, but vulnerability and by invitation; that those who are humble and open to seeing in a new way are the ones who are given hope; that those who seek to hold on to power and who are full of themselves are threatened by this different way of being and so seek to destroy it. This same storyline is played out in the gospel accounts of Jesus' life and results in the ultimate rejection as those in power plot to bring about his death

In the final verse of the hymn it acknowledges that though we have learned much in knowledge and skills since that time, we may not have learnt what humanity is truly about. I know that when human beings are able to live with compassion, empathy and love we come closer to the fullness of our humanity

with a sense of freedom and peace, and that when we live with suspicion, hostility and a disregard for others, not only are we closed down to them but also to ourselves and who we could truly be.

In a world where much of the political and media noise still seems more about generating fear and hostility to the other, I appreciate this carol for the realistic expression of how things are and yet the hope that there is a better way if only we were wise and courageous enough to take it. It is a reminder that the love of God is still at work, transforming the hearts and lives of people throughout our world, who in turn transform lives and situations wherever they are.

It is a source of hope that the light still shines in the darkness and the darkness can never overcome it; that whatever might come, love is always the final word – even though it can sometimes be difficult to keep hold of this.

As we continue into December and approach the season where generosity and hospitality are shared, may we catch a glimpse of how that might be shared more widely and beyond the days of Christmas; that we in turn might surprise our world with the things of heaven!






