

Consultation

Proposal for Development on Land West of Sundon Road, Harlington



Redrow Homes (South Midlands) Limited is bringing forward a proposal for the development of land identified as an allocation in the Central Bedfordshire Local Plan (ref. HAS21), land west of Sundon Road, Harlington.

The proposal seeks the erection of approximately 140 new homes with ancillary open space and landscaping, car parking, internal access ways, principal access and sustainable urban drainage.

As part of the masterplan development, an online public consultation was launched on Monday 29th November 2021 to seek the views of the local community and other interested parties/key stakeholders, the purpose of which will play an important role in shaping the development of the plans for the proposed scheme.

The consultation was initially due to end on Monday 20th December 2021, however, in light of feedback received from the local community we are extending this deadline until **Sunday 16th January 2022.**





Youth World Cup


From the 27th October to the 30th of October 2021, a local young peacemaker who lives in Dunstable, James Jasper Field, attended the Youth World Cup in Turkey as a contestant to try and win the \$10,000 for his humanitarian efforts for Myanmar, a country and people in Southeast Asia who are undergoing extreme hardships since the military coup d'etat in February. The situation in Myanmar is often ignored by mainstream media, and it doesn't get enough attention considering the depths of horror and terror that the people of Myanmar currently

face. Consistent internet shut-downs, abductions, sexual violence, murder and multiple human rights atrocities, the situation in Myanmar is bleak. This is the same genocidal regime who are responsible for the Rohingya genocide and exodus in 2017. The regime has not yet been completely successful because of the revolutionary spirit of the people who stand shoulder to shoulder against this terror.



Bringing awareness of the situation in Myanmar was one of the goals of James at the Youth World Cup, and he has been doing this since founding Answer Myanmar with others in the UK to support the people of Myanmar. James competed with other contestants in the Peace by Entrepreneurship category, and had to present in front of a panel of judges at the summit, as well as create a public campaign to secure votes before the last rounds of the contest in Turkey. James was able to win the semi-finals and become a semi-finalist with a payout of \$1000 from Global Peace Chain (minus their 15% fee). This \$850 will be used for humanitarian assistance to local communities in Myanmar, many of whom are without income since the coup d'etat and the response by the people of the Civil Disobedience Movement. James would like to thank everyone locally who voted for him in the contest and for raising their voices to support the plight of the people of Myanmar. He'd further encourage anyone who is good and able to further support the people by donating to www.mutualaidmyanmar.org or by getting in touch with him at james@answermyanmar.org to take further actions to lobby, fundraise, or to create partnerships to better support the end of this evil regime.



As many of you will be aware, I am the temporary editor for Contact, my second time in this role. My "proper" job on the Contact team is as Chair of the management group, which consists of the Chair, Editor, Treasurer, and church representatives.

Would you like to be Editor?

The job works like this. At the beginning of the month, you remind the regulars of the copy date. From then, until the date, you get the copy trickling in, mostly at the last minute. You may then have to reremind some people (you know who you are), although I feel a month missing out might sharpen minds!

Contact is produced using Microsoft Publisher. Usually, you would start with the previous month's edition, and amend it as you go on, changing dates and articles. You have an editorial to write and you also design a cover and choose a colour. When you have finished, produce a pdf. I usually print a copy for proof reading – it's surprising how often you still find errors – make corrections and produce a new pdf. The pdfs for the content, and covers, are then sent to the printer.

The editor also puts in the adverts, and may well correspond with advertisers, although the treasurer deals with billing.

The appointment of the editor is by Churches Together in Harlington. Interested? Have a word with me. Clive


