## Letter from Rev. Nina Johnson, Methodist Minister

Before becoming a minister in the Methodist Church, I worked for a few years as a landscape gardener. Living in the leafy London suburbs there was always plenty of work for us — mostly garden maintenance. And whenever I think of March my first thoughts still go to those years. The first week of March heralded the start-up of the regular maintenance work and if the weather allowed, the lawnmowers would make the first cut of the season.

We did work throughout the winter as well. I actually started the job one cold January and spent the first week hand digging a large plot of garden to remove weed roots. The winters could be quite hard both in terms of the temperature and also the nature of the work that we had to do. And if conditions were such that we couldn't actually do any work in gardens, we would be servicing the machinery and tools – one year we even gave all the mowers a new coat of Hayter green paint.

I became a gardener really by sheer fluke – it certainly had never entered my thinking and I had never had any interest in gardens before. But it became a real joy – we worked hard but we had a good laugh and various strategies to keep us going on even the most monotonous of tasks.

March always marked a new beginning; the promise of longer days and the warmer days ahead. Winter was over and it would only get better from this point onwards – until the start of the next winter of course!

I have just finished reading a book on *Wintering*. The author interweaves the aspects of winter in the natural world with those times in our lives when we experience our own winters; caused by illness, bereavement, or a myriad of other things that take us into difficult times. And in the book we are encouraged to find a way of acceptance, rest and retreat rather than powering on with some kind of denial and pretence. She also suggests that as with the natural world, there is often a circular rhythm to our wintering rather than a linear one. I found the book helpful and insightful as I reflected on my own past couple of years, and the decisions and future plans that are in place for me.

As I write, we are on the cusp of all the covid restrictions that are currently in place being lifted and by the time you are reading this letter they probably will have done. To many it may feel that the 'wintering' that we have experienced with covid has now come to an end and the 'spring' with all its promise is at last here. For others, the fear or realisation that the virus is still amongst us, and now largely unchecked, may actually prolong the experience of wintering and push spring further down the line.

In the church calendar we are at the beginning of Lent; perhaps traditionally held as a season of wintering for faith, but I believe, to prepare for the fullness of life in resurrection — but that is for the next edition of Contact and writer if they so choose! But in my understanding Lent is not a time for life-denying discipline, but creating space and time to see and engage with the things that are life-giving. Ultimately for me that is held within the love of God and within the love that we are called to live. I still hope and dream for a time when love and compassion become the most prized way of seeing and being as we relate to others and the world. It won't stop winters, but it would lessen the degree and severity of those that we negatively impose and subject others to.

So, let us look and see in this season, this month of promise and flourishing, the things that enable us to live in the hope that it offers.


But did you know we can also take you to the theatre, just out for an old-fashioned drive, to the café or garden centre? More fun things?



<u>Churchyard</u>: today (10<sup>th</sup> February), I was delighted to see the first 2 primrose flowers in the churchyard. A sure sign that Spring is on the way. There is also a specific commemorative Primrose Day, which this year falls on April 19<sup>th</sup>. This date celebrates the anniversary of the death of the British statesman and Prime Minister Benjamin Disraeli. It is said that the primrose was his favourite flower, and Queen Victoria sent a wreath of primroses to his funeral. Meanwhile, someone keeps sending me bunches of flowers with the heads cut off. I think I'm being stalked!

Recycling: just a reminder that we are still collecting biscuit wrappers – sweet and savoury – to send to Terracycle. This also includes biscuit based bars eg Twix, Kit Kat, and own brands, plus cake wrappers which are plastic – from larger cakes or individually wrapped cakes. If you're not sure, pop the wrappers in anyway and I'll forward those I can't recycle to another collector. (Cardboard should be recycled in your own bin). Leave the wrappers in the labelled bin at church (near to the 'normal' waste bins) which is through the side gate on Church Road. Many thanks to those who have already dropped some off.

Restoration Work: we have now had meetings with the stonemasonry company which will undertake the work around the south porch. Restoring buildings like churches is their specialist area and there are many 'rules' to follow which determine the precise type of materials to be used. Timescale will depend on many factors of course, but it would be amazing if we could start in the Summer. To try and look after the church building in the best way we can, we are also exploring the possibility of a Friends of St Mary's group.
