

Letter from Carol Gibbs, Life Church Leader

I am sure as you are reading this the sun will be shining and we will be enjoying longer spring days. Some of us will have trips and holidays to look forward to. I love days out discovering new places. Recently my husband and I visited Ely Cathedral and I was inspired by its grandeur and beauty.

Ely Cathedral is a Christian Church where Christians have worshiped daily for hundreds of years and is a place of prayer and sanctity. The Cathedral is also a historical monument, built to the glory of God, which welcomes thousands of pilgrims and visitors every year. It has an octagonal tower that was built following the collapse of the original Norman central tower in 1322. Alan of Walsingham, the monk responsible for the building, was deeply shocked. One of his fellow monks wrote: 'He was devastated, grieving vehemently and overcome with sorrow... that he knew not which way to turn himself or what to do for the reparation of such a ruin.'



As rebuilding commenced, firmer foundations were found further out from the original pillars, and from this evolved the idea of building an octagon surmounted by a lantern. Its width of 74 feet (23m) was too great to support a stone vault, and so it was built in wood and covered in lead.

A masterpiece of medieval engineering, it took 18 years to build. The internal height is 142 feet (43m), and its total weight is 400 tons. In the centre, John of Burwell (a village south-east of Ely), carved the beautiful Christ in Majesty. We both stood and looked upwards at the awesome structure, carvings and details. It was difficult to resist the urge to lay on the floor and gaze up at its beauty. On the cathedral website it states the 'The Octagon reminds us of how glory can come out of ruin, hope overcome despair and death lead to new life'.

As we explored further we entered the Lady chapel, a place that felt very different from the main part of the cathedral as it was full of light and space. I was struck by a piece of art over in one corner which had been created in memory of those who have lost their lives during the pandemic. It was a pair of large Angel wings, with individual feathers having been created out of glass. As the light hit and went through each part of it, the whole thing glistened and shone with beauty. It reminded me of how Gods love can shine in and through our lives when we live in relationship with him and I felt God really spoke to me through it.

We don't have to visit a cathedral or church building to experience the presence of God. God is present in every area of our lives but sometimes we can feel clos-

er to God in certain places. It may be standing on a hillside or on a walk, in our homes or looking at the waves as they crash upon the shore. Often we can experience God in challenging, difficult or exciting times, but he wants to be in relationship with us in our normal day to day lives.

We have just celebrated Easter, a time Christians remember when Jesus was crucified on a cross and then on the third day rose again. He sent the Holy Spirit to be with us and calls out to you and me. I know God is with me all the time but I also have special times of encountering him like while on our visit to Ely Cathedral.

I pray you will have an special encounter with God in the next few days and weeks but remember he is there all the time waiting for you to open the door and welcome him in.

and my family; it was lovely to see so many of you and I apologise if I didn't get to talk to each and every one of you. Your generosity meant that on the day we raised £278.81 but it looks like we may hit £300.

I am so appreciative of you all for attending, Liz who made the drinks and all those who donated plants, Judy who decorated the little willow wreaths from my willow tree for us to sell and all those who made cakes for us to offer with the drinks or to be taken home to be enjoyed. It was a fantastic effort and a brilliant result. Thank you also to Debbie and Wendy for running a book stall where in excess of £22 was raised, magnificent.

Thank you also to Harlington brownies who decorated Easter bonnets to wear on wear a hat day and raised £15, absolutely brilliant and a great deal of fun.

Final thanks to those sharing plants I can offer for donations. I have received a fir tree, foxgloves, hydrangeas, roses, pheasant berries and wild garlic to name but a few; always exciting to receive plants from supporters. Update on my tomatoes ... they have germinated and it is very exciting to see this new life; my compost bin lid has been seen in a nearby garden, need to speak to the neighbours to retrieve it; regarding Lewis's tomato seeds, there is nothing showing yet but he has dug so many holes that he has probably buried them 10 times over; he did check a week later and ask where his tomatoes were but I think he has forgotten them now! As well as the cauliflower, cabbage and leeks already germinated, I have set some pasqueflower, dahlias and pinks. I am just waiting for warmer weather to clear bigger stuff out of my growhouse to make room for my endless seed trays, please keep checking what plants I have on offer.

Finally I have 2 containers with seeds; one with salad style seeds: lettuce, tomatoes, spring onions, cucumbers etc and a separate tin with vegetable seeds in, kindly donated by Kate and Nick. The seeds are all in alphabetical order so if you fancy a bit of growing gardening magic please come and choose a packet of seeds, make a small donation if you would like to, I can even offer you a plant pot or seed tray if you are a novice, I am happy to encourage everyone in Harlington to enjoy the joy of gardening.

So wishing you all a happy growing season, gardens full of colour and pleasure and fresh vegetables and salad to grace your mealtimes and help you all to eat and lead healthy lives so that we can continue our fight to reduce the number of those who suffer with brain tumours. Good Neighbours - Harlington Neighbourhood Help (HNH) A few stats for a change!

So far in 2022 we have completed over 150 'jobs' for residents in the village. These are often to the L&D or Bedford Hospitals where we wait for the client and bring them back to their front door. If someone is feeling vulnerable and is infirm or elderly or cannot for any reason get to their medical appointments, it is extremely reassuring to have a friendly volunteer to do this. We have also dropped off and picked up many prescriptions from Toddington, Barton and locally. We have been to several dentists, opticians, and doctors and taken people for their jabs. We have dropped people at Tesco and ASDA, helped get dogs to the VETS, been round Poplars, and sometimes just got people to the café for a cuppa and a chat.

We are non-profit and ask for donations only and our volunteers are paid 45p per mile from this. Our 20 volunteers all live in the village and get a tremendous satisfaction and pleasure in helping in this way. Many of us have lost our own parents and couldn't help them when alive as they lived far away and needed such schemes, so there is a lot of giving back.

We do need more volunteers as people start to go back to work a bit more often so do get in touch if you'd like a chat. It is not onerous and you don't have to commit to every day – specific hours and days are fine as we run a spreadsheet. We will also take you out on a few buddy trips the first few times. You do need to be D&B checked but we can help with the process and all of the cost of that.

Through January and February you will not have seen hedgehogs as they will have been in hibernation. Through March and April they will have started to emerge having lost a 3rd of their body weight! Ensuring food and water is left out will help them regain this lost weight. Meaty cat or dog food (not fish flavour!) or kitten biscuits is what they love most.

In April not only have they been trying to put on weight but they will be busy building nests ready to have their young - hoglets. If you are lucky enough to have a nest in your garden, in June the hedgehog will have around 5 to 6 hoglets in a litter. That extra food you put out will then be ever more important!!



Harlington Supports... Homes for Ukraine

I am sure many of you will have seen the news and images of the horrors unfolding in Ukraine.

There have been lots of appeals we have been able to support since the invasion began.

However, the launch of the **Homes for Ukraine** scheme gave an opportunity for individuals to make a further significant contribution to help individuals and families fleeing conflict.

The Homes for Ukraine system seems overly complicated and frankly daunting. What forms do we need to fill in? When should we start the process and what happens when the individuals or families we sponsor arrive?

Perhaps the scariest part is how to find and get in touch with a family to sponsor. There are various sites (such as Host4ukraine.com) which act as a billboard for families and sponsors, however, they can be overwhelming.

Harlington Supports

A few people in Harlington linked together through the Harlington Facebook pages with the intention of working out how to address these issues as a village. Some offering to host and some offering much needed support.

We are fortunate that there are people within Harlington who have trusted friends in Ukraine. As well as hosting people themselves, they have been able to introduce hosts with people looking for sponsors.

As a result we've been able to allocate 5 families to 5 hosts, and are actively looking to fill several other rooms. For families, it is generally mothers and children. Fairly early in the conflict men were not permitted to leave Ukraine (unless in exceptional circumstances).

As we go through the visa process, we have also built and are continuing to build a support network for the families when they arrive.

We'll be reaching out and connecting with other villages doing the same.

Can you help?

If you are looking to host we have built up a support group in the village to guide you through the process. We'll be able to find people looking for rooms and introduce you and them to our expanding support network.

But you don't need to host to help. Hosting is really not for everyone for a whole range of reasons, and no one should feel under any pressure to host.

However, you can help. Helping doesn't need to be significant and it doesn't



The picture was printed on the aida fabric. When the stitching was completed, the printing was soaked out, before framing. A chart was provided with the kit, to aid in working out any difficult bits.
