



## Letter from Rev. Nina Johnson, Methodist Minister

"In my beginning is my end... In my end is my beginning" – so begins and ends TS Eliot's Poem East Coker.

This is my last letter for Contact as I will be moving at the end of this month. Exactly a year ago (at the time of writing), I began to consider the possibility of leaving my current church role for something else. And there were plans that seemed to be in place that would enable a smooth transition from here to Cornwall. Alas, sometimes our plans and expectations are thwarted by the actions of others.

So the packing that I started a couple of months ago, now needs to be repacked with only the essentials that I can store in a family member's home, until permanent accommodation becomes available. A lifetime acquisition of 'stuff' now needs to be discarded. And I find myself pondering the move that took me to my first manse (the home provided by the church for ministers to live in), with very little 'stuff'



and most of that being second hand having been given to me by family and family friends. It feels almost like coming full circle, as Eliot's poem suggests to me.

The poem describes what to me seems like waiting in the 'empty' time or space; to be in that place where we have to live without trying to fill it, because we may end up filling it with the wrong thing. To be able to stay in the situation where there is so much that is unknown to us is difficult but the waiting is what also holds hope. So often our human need is to fix things, come up with strategies and other plans even though we may feel that they offer us less. We feel the need to 'do something' whatever that might be.

It is much harder to wait and to wait with humility as we realise that in the end, there is so much that is out of our control ... but in this we can begin to realise what is essential to us as human beings and what truly belongs to our wellbeing.

For me what is essential is love, the love that comes ultimately from God. In my waiting is a trust in God, not a trust that is based on an expectation that nothing difficult will befall me, but a living hope that if I have the love of God, then I have all that I need.

As I cross this new threshold of being, a new threshold of living into the unknown, where I do not have a home of my own apart from a converted campervan, where I do not have work and a regular income, I am reminded of strangely

coming full circle, and I am reminded very much of Julian of Norwich's prayer:

God, of your goodness, give me yourself, for you are sufficient for me.

I cannot properly ask anything less, to be worthy of you.

If I were to ask anything less

## A Tale of Two Brinklows (or Pearl and Don)...

A death notice in this magazine some months ago not only caused me to mourn the departure of another long-term village resident, but also caused me to again reflect upon the time I have spent (on and off) in this place.

Some families seem to almost grow up out of the soil they live in (and you can see some of those names on the village War Memorial) and some like me got blown here in around 1963 from Hammersmith via Dunstable.

The person I was mourning was Pearl Everett (neé Brinklow), late of Lincoln Way. She was the long-serving organist at St Mary's Church and was already playing here when my parents moved here in those early 1960's. Kingsley Fleming was vicar of the Parish when I sang in the choir each Sunday (rehearsal Thursday evenings, 2s 6d for weddings). My Mother was horrified when I spent the proceeds from one such event on a folding penknife in the hardware shop that was once in the Lincoln Way parade.

I have always tried to see the young person that becomes the older one and my 10 year old's memory can see the 89 year old Pearl as 29 again...considered slightly glamorous for the village with reddish hair worn up...a young Mum with her family back garden abutting the end of ours in Monmouth Road.

Pearl's father was Don Brinklow and he owned and ran Brinklow's Stores (more recently the old premises of Bradshaws), across the road from the Parish Hall (once Harlington County Primary School - which I attended until the end of 1966). Two of my teachers Mrs Hillyard and Mrs Rutherford still live here too.

Brinklow's was one of the 'go to' after-school sweet shops. In those years we not only had the parade of shops in Lincoln Way, but also White's Stores (next door to Mrs Brown the headmistress' house opposite the school) and another new premises nearby to The Carpenter's Arms. Happy minutes choosing the new confectionery that the 1960's also brought to us.

Pearl, White's, the Primary School and Brinklow's store have gone and a lot has also arrived here since those 1960's days...Park Leys, the Robinson Crescent development and the Upper School...and soon a further expansion of the village might be upon us.

Goodness knows what the village population made of the Goswell End/Lincoln Way/Monmouth Road development back then...what a huge cultural change that must have been? The previous owners of the house I currently live in erected a six-foot high brick wall at the bottom of the garden to screen off the 'incomers', but as a child it just made me happy to live in a wonderful place of cornfields and pigs, rope swings on the trees in the Spinney and a daily helping of a Jamboree bag or Fry's 5-Guy chocolate! ## Lois' Great Big Spanish Adventure

I can't believe it has only been a year since I left Harlington, so much has happened. I think the last article I wrote was during the Summer when I stayed on the Isle Of Wight in my Motorhome.

In August with the advent of the Covid vaccine, and life seemingly opening up again, I booked the ferry to Santander to start my search for a villa in earnest. All was going well until the van broke down. Luckily I had RAC membership and they sorted everything – an hotel in Palencia, and the van in a dealership. As there was a long wait for a replacement part, I hired a car to continue my



trip. I got to Torre Pachecco (near Alicante), where I'd rented an apartment for 3 weeks and got on with my house hunting. Having done fairly extensive research over the last few years, I knew roughly which area I wanted to be. My search eventually led me to an 'urbanisation' called Camposol, about 12 miles inland from Peurto de Mazarron in the region of Murcia.

I was really lucky and found a lovely 2 bedroom, 2 bathroom villa on the best



sector. Lots of shops, bars, restaurants, a medical centre, vets, beauty salons etc all within a short walk. Describing it as a 2 bed villa doesn't really do it justice – it is on a 476sq metre plot, with a huge underbuild the size of the whole footprint of the villa. This will be converted to a games room in due course. There is also a large tiled patio with a utility room tucked under the external steps leading up to the tiled roof terrace.

From here I had a grandstand view of the fireworks on New Year's Eve. The external veranda has been glazed effectively giving me another sunny lounge (as well as the one in the villa). All this for the princely sum of 145k euros (or about 120k GBP)! What would you get in England for that?

We completed on 14<sup>th</sup> December, so I drove out with the dog on the day Macron shut France! I held my breath getting off the ferry at St Malo as I wasn't a European resident then, and even with a negative Covid test, Macron didn't want us Brits. Thankfully border control let me through once they knew I was going to Spain. A manic 2-day drive and we were there. Omicron however, did mean

my friend couldn't share the drive down, and one of my sons couldn't come out as planned over the holidays which was rather disappointing.

And now the tricky part – Residency! I knew what the criteria was for a Non-Lucrative Visa ie. You show you can support yourself with private healthcare and enough money in the bank so you are not a burden on the Spanish system.

However, as with everything post Brexit, it's more complicated than that. I found a fantastic solicitor on-line who held my hand the whole way through. I had to have a private medical as my GP wouldn't do it, then the private doctor had to be registered with the Foreign Office – more paperwork just as Omicrom hit and the doctor was busy in ITU! An Acro police check – no problem there, Both the medical certificate and the police check had to be Apostilled and translated (more expense). Then basically you jump through administrative hoops – proof of income ie. letters re house sale and inheritance, corresponding bank

statements etc. Proof of investments, income and so on. Once finalised, I applied to the Consulate in the UK for an appointment and booked a flight (you have to apply in person in your country of origin). All sorted – documents delivered etc. However, they keep your passport and the process can take between 2 and 6 weeks. I was lucky, after a couple of weeks sofasurfing at various friends, my visa was




ready and I could book a flight home as a European Resident!!!!

If anyone else is thinking of doing this – do it! I haven't looked back and despite coming out by myself, having thrown myself in to tennis, walking football and a choir(!), I have made so many new friends. There are also organised days out, lunch clubs and activities. It takes 15 minutes in the car to get to the beautiful beaches and/or the mountains. The nearest airport is RMU Corvera – about 30 minutes away.

Messy Church next meets at 4 pm on the 18th June, when we will look at one of Jesus' miracles.






What is the largest thing you have ever made? Mine was the crocheted bed-spread/blanket I made during lockdown. That was a single bed size.
