

Letter from the Methodist Church

"Go and look towards the sea," Elijah told his servant, and he went up and looked. "There is nothing there," he said. Seven times Elijah said, "Go back." The seventh time the servant reported, "A cloud as small as a man's hand is rising from the sea." 1 Kings 18: 43 – 44a

This passage is the Bible source for the line in the harvest hymn "Saw ye not the cloud arise..."

One of the places Tina and I like to go on holiday is Crantock in Cornwall. Crantock is a village with a lovely beach just west of Newquay. It is separated from Newquay by the River Gannel.

When we first went to Crantock, the river flowed out to the sea along the Pentire Head, to the east of the bay, but a few years ago that changed, and the river started to flow across the beach. Initially this didn't seem to be a big change, but gradually the whole shape of the beach has changed, The sea comes further in to the sand dunes, and these have eroded, showing where there is rock underneath. This year we have noticed that, at high tide, the beach divides into two bays.

Back in the middle 1700s, resources seemed infinite. There was a whole world to explore and exploit and new advances in materials made everything seem possible. Coal could be used in place of charcoal to make iron and steel, which allowed greater quantities to be produced. Canals, and later railways, made possible by the increased amount of iron, enabled people and goods to be transported further, faster. Raw materials were shipped in from an expanding empire, and cities expanded. No-one saw the cloud arise.

People still want to ignore Climate Change. A lot pay lip-service to the idea, but doing something significant is expensive and a major disruption to their way of life. It is getting harder to ignore, though. When temperatures reach the 40s Centigrade, we are forced to take notice. It still takes a back seat to the rising cost of living, though, and has not so far been a major feature of the current political debate, unlike taxes.

The world is ours to enjoy, but the way we treat it is more like vandalism. We have already used more than our share of resources. We need to act now, because improving things will take time, they will get worse before they get better. What are we willing to do for ourselves, our families, our neighbours?

Hedgehogs plus HNH Good Neighbours

With the lovely weather, many of us will be clearing our gardens and giving the lawn a good mow. Please check the grass for any wildlife such as hedgehogs and frogs. If you do find one, gently move into undergrowth and leave it – it will move on in it's own time. If you find a hedgehog during the day, it may be sick. If you have any concerns please contact a local wildlife rescue such as Leighton Buzzard Rescue, The Hedgehog Preservation Society or a local vet or if you are a member of the Harlington Hedgehog Facebook page, you can always ask for advice.

Please keep in mind hedgehogs and other wildlife when carrying out sports or DIY activities in your gardens. Take any nets in at the end of the day so hedgehogs will not get tangled, make sure there is a way in/out of your garden if you have a new fence, ensure there is a way out of a pond – although hedgehogs are great swimmers, they need to have a way out should they fall in. Make sure any holes in the ground from posts or drains are blocked/covered so a hedgehog won't fall in. These are just a few examples of where hedgehogs may run into problems as they have a great sense of smell but terrible eye sight. This is also not including any other wildlife.

A little mention for any allotment holders – please check your polytunnels or any cage/chicken wired structures for birds before you leave. A few times in the last week, birds have been trapped either through a door left open or finding a hole to fly through. The birds were waved out and flew off, but in the heat, it won't take long for them to get tired and run into issues. Plus, you don't want your prized raspberries getting eaten!

Enjoy the lovely weather enabling you to stay outside later in the evening and hopefully therefore capturing a glimpse of your hedgehog visitors – they are so interesting to watch.

Some broken promises can be reversed – but building on the green belt cannot. Come the next general election, the Tories will find that their traditional supporters – myself included – have deserted them.



<u>Churchyard</u>: if you have visited the churchyard recently you may have noticed the "wild" areas of grass left uncut in the churchyard. This is to encourage wild flowers to grow and seed. In an area to the right, inside the church archway, Lady's Bedstraw flowers are there in abundance. The frothy, yellow flowers have a sweet honey-like scent and flower from June to September. The name is said to be derived from the tradition of stuffing straw mattresses with the flowers, particularly for women about to give birth. Other good news is that all the baby birds appear to have fledged, and the bird bath by the south porch is getting a lot of use for washing and drinking. Do you know what birds spend all the time on their knees?.....Birds of prey of course!

<u>Gift Day</u>: 10th September This is our annual appeal day, and letters explaining this will be coming through your door not long before that. The church will be open from 10am-4pm, with scone and cake afternoon teas available between 2-4pm. Pop in to see us. We'll have some photos on display of the restoration work we are due to start on the south porch, and information sheets about the history of the church itself.

Recycling: a reminder that St Mary's is collecting sweet <u>and</u> savoury biscuit wrappers to recycle. This includes ordinary biscuit wrappers and things like Twix or Kit Kat wrappers and own brands; things like Ryvita wrappers etc, and any sweet biscuit or cake wrapper (not chocolate bar wrappers). We can't take cat pouches, or other wrappers eg for vegetables, tea and so on and cardboard should be recycled via your household bins. There is a large black bin, labelled for recycling, in the bin storage area through the side gate off Church Road. Thank you.
