



Letter from the New Methodist Minister

Dear friends, I will try to introduce myself and my background, explaining how God has ripened my vocation. Thanks to the experiences God has allowed me, faith has become very concrete in my life; faith for me also means action.

FIRST STEP: Familiar/ecclesiastic

I grew up in Italy in a Protestant family, in a spiritual home, where attending Church, praying before a meal, gathering to read the Bible, saying thanks to the Lord for something beautiful, or asking help in the difficulties were natural, daily things. Besides, I am a daughter of two Waldensian Presbyters.

My family lived the Gospel. Since childhood, people knocked at our door. People sat at our table for just lunch or lived with us for months, even for years. They were often poor, hungry, foreigners who fled from countries such as Tunisia, Morocco and Albania. This openness shaped the way I see my relationship with others and showed a model of life which has given me deep sensitivity.

One story. A boy in our congregation was found almost dead of an overdose. Giuseppe did not want to go to a centre for drug addicts. My father spoke with him for a long time and convinced him to go to the hospital to detoxify. The pact was that, after this, he would come and live in our house. My father had attended a special course about the problems of drugs and told us what we needed to know, to do and to tell in our relationship with him. My mother spent hours speaking and listening to him. One night Giuseppe and I put our heads out of the window, staring at the moon. He unexpectedly started to cry saying: "God, who has never existed for me, is suddenly speaking with me. Claudia, you and your family have welcomed me as a member of your family giving me a new possibility of resurrection. In this night of stars, I can see the joy in your hugs and smiles and discover what friendship is. Here, I see God who can give meaning to the nonsense with his strength, and light after the darkness I have lived in the last seven years." At that moment, I knew I wanted to become a bringer of hope to those who lived in the dark.

Another childhood memory: a member of our congregation, a poor peasant, is ill and in bed. She is worried and afraid of losing her harvest. I see my mum, her Presbyter, picking tomatoes in her field ... for hours and hours. This was another example of vocation for me. I realised that pastoral work can start and finish where we want. In my Ministry, I definitely want to remember this example of love and humbleness that God put in front of my eyes.

When I think about my vocation in action, I think of Jesus feeding the five thousand. The touching sign for me is not the multiplication, but the sharing! I think that until there are people able to accept dialogue, meeting and welcome, we will not move toward the Kingdom. I am convinced that we can know God more in sharing than in everything else. Like the apostle Paul says: "I may have all the faith needed to move mountains, but if I have no love, I am nothing".

As my parents were both Presbyters we often moved. Because of this, I have rarely visited my own grandparents or aunts or cousins. They were always far from us. But I have so many aunts and cousins and grandparents in my memories. These were the brothers and sisters of our Churches. My family and I had many moments of joy and some moments of difficulty, but the Church was always there. The congregations have been singing of God's grace! This was my Church model and still is now.

SECOND STEP: Social

As a teenager I looked to strengthen and broaden my experiences. In Naples, I worked as a volunteer in a Methodist centre, "Incontri" (meetings). I was a high-school student, but I went to this centre every time I could. There were prostitutes, ill of AIDS, and prisoners (in part-time freedom, but serving a lifetime sentence). From these people, I learned what uncertainty, fear, pain, exploitation, and hunger were. I also understood what it meant to desire a new life and to start over again.

Living with people with discomforts I learned, little by little, to refer myself to them without fear, but with huge joy. I especially have a strong memory of Emanuele. He was a prisoner. I remember spending some days, looking at the hands of Emanuele who had killed a man by cutting his head. After a while, I discovered that he was not a killer for me anymore, but a man with his sensitiveness. I was suddenly aware that, beyond the barriers of prejudice existed understanding, listening and love.

Speaking with him, I noticed how much I cared about him. So I wondered: Why should God not love him? Why would God not love and forgive Emmanuele who was sorry for his past? After understanding this, I announced to Emanuele "the Lord of love" with incredible joy. I discovered how it is beautiful to announce a God of grace and how the Holy Spirit acts where you do not expect it.

During my studies I decided to work as a volunteer with abandoned minors (Cooperative Social Association "Il Simbolo" Pisa). This was a Catholic place. I remember my frustration because they did not allow me to pray, I could not freely speak about God, only the Catholic chaplain could. This situation confirmed my calling to be a Presbyter. Later I had the opportunity to work with juvenile offenders (especially Albanians) as an occasional social worker in the emergency section for three months. Here I learned to measure my limits and my strength.

I chose a new experience in a period of emergency during the Kosovo war. I worked as a volunteer with 40 people who escaped from this war in a Baptist Centre (Campi di Annibale - close to Roma) for some months. For once, although I was not watching the news on television, I could see the looks of those people with my own eyes. I could catch what those eyes expressed and I could understand which feelings the war could raise. The children's drawings were also a witness of this! It was a strong experience that helped me to understand the war and all its problems and taught me a lot about my self-control.

People were often nervous and sometimes violent. The loss of their dear ones and their houses understandably brought anger and pain. It once happened that a man hurled me to the floor because he did not want to respect the rota for cleaning the centre. Here I discovered how much love these people needed in spite of their behaviours. God always pushed me to act with love and patience often transforming my upset into love.

In all these moments of my life, I fully lived the solidarity through hugs, tears and friendship. For me, it is important to stay in contact with the people who are in pain, who are alone, who suffer for different reasons, those at the margin of society, also those discriminated against because of race, gender and sexual orientation, those unjustly judged by individuals and sometimes even by church, in order to share with them what I own, to bring hope and dignity and give them my time, my capacity to listen, my practical help.

I believe in community work, and I think it has to be done with other denominations/confessions and with the help of the community itself, regardless of their faith. We are on the same journey and we must help one another!

New Appointments available at the Doctors



As some of you may be aware, the government has asked GP surgeries to offer an Extended Access service. Extended access is the offer of pre-bookable appointments outside of our core contractual hours. These can be either early morning, evening or weekends.

Harlington and Sundon Medical Centre will be working in conjunction with five other Luton practices (Bute House Medical Centre, Oakley Surgery, Leagrave Surgery, Lister House Surgery and Dr Mirza's Practice), which make up the Hatters Health Primary Care Network.

Hatters Health PCN will be contacting patients through text, telephone calls or post, to invite targeted groups of patients for appointments, which can be at any of the surgeries mentioned. These appointments can range from <u>diabetes and lifestyle educational evenings</u>, <u>NHS health checks</u>, and <u>women's or men's health sessions</u>, to name a few of the services that are to be offered. I hope Harlington patients will take advantage of this service.

It is also time when <u>covid boosters</u> are due again. Harlington and Sundon Medical Centre intend to put on limited covid booster clinics. To attend the covid clinics you must fall into one of the following categories,

- aged 65 and over
- be immuno-suppressed
- living with an immuno-suppressed person

We will contact patients when these clinics are available to offer appointments.

If you have any queries about whether you are eligible or not for the vaccination, please speak to our reception team. Any eligible groups must have previously received a primary vaccination and previous covid boosters.

Jean Carrington 23rd Oct 1934 - 20th August 2022

This is an abridged version of a tribute written by Jean's daughter Dawn, and read at Jean's funeral.

Jean, christened Jean Mary Miller was born in Southall, West London in 1934. She was a talented athlete and sportsperson, and loved to be physically active. She shared a lifelong love of square dancing with her older brother Ken, and met her husband Roy at a square dance in the mid 1950s. They married in 1960, and moved to Luton.

Their daughter Dawn was born in 1964 and Jean was a stay at home mum. She was very artistic, but was unable to pursue a career in her favourite subjects of needlework or art. This didn't stop her expressing her creativity, and she made most of the family's clothes. Then in 1974, Jean won a house buying competition in the Daily Express which meant they could move to Harlington, where houses cost a bit more!

Jean threw herself wholeheartedly into village life, making many new friends, participating in and helping to organise countless clubs and activities including the WI, Arts and Crafts, and a badminton club. She attended square dancing groups as well as volunteering for numerous committees including the Village Fete and annual Flower and Veg Show. After Roy's death in 2005, Jean continued to be very active in the village; in St Mary's Church, the choir, an art class, a music class, the U3A, a debating group, and the Strollers walking group.

Jean was always beautifully dressed and known for her sense of style. She was also very caring, with a beautiful smile, and had the ability to talk to anyone and put them at their ease. She loved and valued her family and friends, and especially her daughter Dawn. Her compassion extended to animals and wildlife. She fed generations of hedgehogs and birds in her garden and particularly loved rabbits and budgies. Another of her great loves was Cliff Richard - she had been a fan of his since 1958. Jean was still going to his live concerts in her 80s.

Dawn moved to America in 2000, and Jean travelled to New York annually until prevented by health. She suffering a stroke early in 2022, and moved into a care home, where she gained a reputation for being 'the resident with the most friends and visitors'. She is now reunited with her husband and soul mate Roy.

Jean is very much missed by her many friends and family and I shall fondly remember Jean greeting me at her front door with her house rabbit cradled on her shoulder, and her budgie calling in the background. I knew Jean through several groups, including the Village Show Committee and St Mary's Church. She was unfailingly kind, generous and caring, making time for everyone. 
