Last month you may have noticed the poppy decorations around the village commemorating the Armistice. The inspiration for the project came from Dawn Gilbert, who wanted to see further use of the poppy wreaths, rather than just dumping them in the bin.

#### Lots of News this Month



- Sundon Medical Centre and Harlington Surgery are still in the process of **getting our phones upgraded**. But some technical issues have come to light, causing a delay to this being completed. I would like to apologise if this causes any issues in contacting the surgery, but this is in the process of being fixed – please bear with us.
- **Flu clinics** have taken place over the last couple of months, and we have had over 2000 Sundon and Harlington patients vaccinated so far. Having your flu vaccination is important flu is unpleasant for most people, it can be dangerous and even life threatening for some people, particularly those with certain health conditions. Vaccinations are limited, so if you would like to have your flu vaccination, please contact reception.
- <u>Covid clinics</u> have successfully taken place over the last two months. These clinics are only available for a limited time; if you are 65 or over, or immuno-suppressant, please check with reception for available Covid clinic dates.
- We are pleased to announce that we have employed another GP: <u>**Dr Dilan**</u> <u>**Joshi**</u>, who started with us in November. He will be an excellent addition to our clinical team, and I hope you find he is as dedicated and valuable to patient care as we do.
- In last month's edition, I explained about the <u>Hatters Health Network</u>, who are commissioned to complete services on our behalf. If you have had any services completed by the Network, I would be interested to hear how you felt about the service that took place.
- As winter has now approached and the weather has changed, patients with <u>Chronic Obstruction Pulmonary Disease</u> (<u>COPD</u>) will be contacted by dedicated pharmacist for reviews.
- I would like to remind patients that <u>we will be closed</u> on the <u>26/27 December</u> as well as the <u>2 January</u>. Also, please make sure you put in any <u>medication</u> <u>requests to Leigh-Anne</u> in the dispensary no later than by the <u>16 December</u> to ensure you receive your medication before the holiday closures.

All sorts of crafts can be used to make pictures, but this is one I haven't tried! If you remember the August article, I showed a picture of a crocheted blanket, made in panels. Well, have a look at this!

This blanket has also been made from a pattern supplied by Lovecrafts, and is not quite complete. The crafter is my sister, who took the blanket to show my mother on a day when I was there as well. It has been made as a continuous piece, starting at the bottom.

Unlike the August blanket, this is made in the intarsia style – working the colours into the design as you go along, the way I knitted Christmas jumpers some years ago. (Much of the blanket pictured in August had the

"picture" elements crocheted separately and stitched on afterwards.) My sister has refused to let me see the reverse, and in this picture the number of bobbins of different colour yarns are not visible.

Our December meetings will be  $5^{th}$  and  $19^{th}$ . The first meeting in January 2023 will be  $16^{th}$  – it would be  $2^{nd}$ , but that is a bank holiday, and I don't suppose many would want to come. All meetings will be the hybrid version, on Zoom as well as in person. Please let me know if you want the Zoom link for a meeting.

### **Christmas Letter from the Churches**

#### In the bleak midwinter Frosty wind made moan

It has been cold and bleak so far for some this winter, with people cutting back on warmth, unsure whether to spend money on eating or heating. It has certainly been a bleak winter for the people of Ukraine, where winters are so very cold and where power supplies have been deliberately disrupted by aggressive acts of war, targeting ordinary people. As a consequence, there is a bleak outlook for many in East Africa with grain supplies being prevented from leaving Ukraine, an action which makes worse the global hunger crisis, particularly in that region.

Then there are people in specific difficulties: homeless in this country for a whole host of reasons, people in other countries such as Ukraine where the bombs have caused homelessness with people forced to flee their own country.

In the bleak midwinter, we need to remind ourselves of the cheery things, the signs of beauty, the signs of hope. Remember the red berries of November, the beauty of trees in autumn, the marvellous gardens in the village, the community together at Remembrance, the welcome and hospitality offered by people to others in need, the service people give to others at work or in their own time.

In December, we remind ourselves of the gift of Jesus, who came into a bleak world, into a country occupied by foreign forces, into a poor family, into a family who became homeless and were compelled to rely on the generosity of others.

#### In the bleak midwinter a stable place sufficed the Lord God Almighty, Jesus Christ.

He came to bring good news to the poor and to liberate the oppressed. He came to bring hope into the world. He came to bring light into the world. So as we approach Christmas we surround ourselves with light: Christmas lights decorating our houses, colourful lights on Christmas trees, candles in churches. We also sing traditional carols that remind us of a message of hope, of happiness, and of generosity that symbolises Christmas at its best.

Above all Christmas is a time for sharing, for taking time out, for reflecting on what really matters. Finally, back again to Christina Rosetti's famous carol:


What can I give him? Poor as I am If I were a shepherd I would give a lamb If I were a wise man I would do my part But what I can I give him Give him my heart



## **Hibernating Hedgehogs!**

Hibernation is NOT being asleep. It's a state of torpor - core body temperature will drop, heart rate & breathing slow right down, all normal activity ceases. A hibernating hog will be completely rolled & will not be woken by touch or noise. It's not a continuous state, hedgehogs will rouse during spells of milder weather & go looking for a snack. Some might even move to a different hibernaculum (nest where they hibernate).

There is no set time for hibernation, it can vary around the country & is triggered by temperature. Some may start in early October, others, if it's fairly warm, might not hibernate at all!

Because of the physical drain keeping alive in what could be called suspended animation has on the body, hedgehogs lose around 2-3g of weight a day. It doesn't sound much - but in order to survive they need to weigh at least 650g before they start, and will be very hungry & thirsty when they emerge, which again, is temperature driven. An unseasonable warm spell followed by a cold snap can be fatal.

Please don't read this & disturb any hibernating hedgehogs to weigh them or move them! Disturbing a hibernating hog or trying to wake it can kill it. If you do accidentally disturb a tightly curled hedgehog, leave it alone & cover it back
