



#### **Letter from the Methodist Church**

January is named for the Roman god, Janus, the god with two faces, one looking forward and the other looking back; highly appropriate for the New Year. At this time, we both look back to the past and forward to the future.

The last year has not been a good one for many. We seemed to have just dealt with Covid, and to have relegated that to business as usual, when we have a major war in Europe, and the highest inflation since the 1970s. So we look to the future and wonder what this will bring us. What a cheerful prospect!



In general Methodists are not that keen on liturgy, that is formal prepared services. Most of what we have is shamelessly taken from the Church of England, with minor changes over the years. This is not surprising as both John and Charles Wesley, the founders of Methodism, were Anglican clergymen. However, we are still in the season of Christmas, when we remember that God came to us as the baby Jesus, who lived and died to show us what love would do. Jesus, when asked about the Commandments, chose two passages from the Hebrew scriptures, (Old Testament) to sum them up as, "Love God, and love your neighbour".

Maybe if we work on these, we will truly be able to wish people:

## St. Mary's Talk plus Harlington Heritage Trust

#### WHO DO YOU THINK YOU ARE?

A talk to help us learn, remember, and understand. Presented around the time of Holocaust Memorial Day which is on Jan 27th



#### 29<sup>th</sup> January at 3pm in St Mary's Church, free entry

Howard Mann will present a personal account of how his own family was affected by the events which took place during WW11. Howard lives in Harlington and frequently gives talks for local organisations such as Rotary. Although his subjects usually relate to his interests in science and astronomy, this talk describes an unexpected journey of discovery about his roots in Piotrkow in Poland which he undertook back in 2008.

His talk will introduce his family and will unfold the story of how he came to make this journey and what he discovered - extraordinary facts about his grand-parents and how they came to England early in the twentieth century, plus the terrible scar that WW2 left on his wider family and on Poland itself. There was even a surprise bonus. Inevitably his journey included the camps at Auschwitz and Birkenau, which makes it appropriate to tell this story around the time we commemorate Holocaust Memorial Day.

27<sup>th</sup> January marks the anniversary of the liberation of Auschwitz-Birkenau, the largest Nazi death camp. HMD is an international day to remember, amongst others, the 6 million Jews murdered during the Holocaust. The theme for HMD 2023 is 'Ordinary People' to remember all the 'ordinary' people whose lives were impacted in such a dreadful way. Each year across the UK, thousands of people come together to learn more about the past and take action to create a safer future.

### **Harlington Heritage Trust**

Our first talk of 2023 will be Sunday 22 January in Harlington Village Hall at 15.00. The speaker will be Bryan Marsh on the topic of "The 1904/1905 Albert Brown Trophy Event – a pioneering motorbike race with local interest".

Sunday 19 February in Harlington Village Hall at 15.00 there will be a talk by Harry White and Louise Pratt on "Keech Hospice Care – Creation to Current Day".

The cost for each talk is £4 for members and £5 for non-members, including refreshments afterwards.

Other HHT events for 2023 will be publicised in the HHT members' newsletter, 'Contact' magazine and the HHT website.

## Angela Hillyard plus HNH Good Neighbours

#### In memory of Angela Hillyard - 1932 to 2022

Angela first came to Harlington in the early1960s, as the deputy head of Harlington Primary School. The school was then in what is now the Parish Hall, with an overflow class in the Village Hall. She lived in Sharpenhoe at the time and cycled up Abbott's Hill in all weathers.

Later she moved to Westoning Road, opposite the new primary school, but by the time it was fully in operation she had changed jobs to be Head of Streatley Primary School. By now she was driving a little mini. It suited her.

She never had the opportunity to stay on at school, due to her family circumstances (she was one of 6 children) so she took a job in the office of Luton College so she could take the courses she needed to get into teacher training at Offley Place. She took her Bachelor and Masters degrees at the same time as holding down her profession as a teacher. She had a life long love of learning, especially enjoying local history and contributed to the County History magazines. Until just a year before her death she was learning Latin for the fun of it!

In 1980 Douglas and Angela moved from Westoning Road to the old Harlington Arms on Station Road, where Douglas set up a craft pottery. Mum supported his ambitions until they both retired. They had a wonderful retirement travelling to Australia and New Zealand for 5 winters between 1991 and 2001, buying a campervan and travelling round, exploring the geology, history and wildlife of the country.

Angela was very well known in the village, being an active member of the Church, the Heritage Trust, the Ramblers, and through Dad, also enjoying the Arts and Crafts Society and the Garden Society. Even if you don't know her through those activities you may well have seen this wonderful, rather eccentric lady walking round the village, picking up other people's litter and collecting the elastic bands dropped by the postie.

At the age of 90 she organised her own birthday tea party for 50 guests. She died shortly afterwards, having lived a very full and adventurous life.

We have had over 400 'jobs' this year in the village

Transport requests are for anyone who has difficulty using local public transport, but tend to come from some of our older residents. They are driven by DBS checked **volunteer drivers** who wait during the appointment, and are currently offered reimbursement at the rate of 45p per mile. We always need more drivers. Most local journeys are currently completely free thanks to donations.

Our committee has 7 members including a Chair, Secretary, Treasurer, and Minutes Secretary. All are volunteers and are elected at the AGM each year.




