
Letter from the Methodist Minister

Marjorie Williams R.I.P. Part 1: The early years



On 6th. March we said our final good byes to Marjorie Williams, a much loved and respected villager and St. Mary's church member who moved into Foster Road when the houses in that road were first built. Marjorie was a very private person, so not much of her background was known. Consequently, there were some surprises when Sue, a longstanding friend from Northumberland, discovered Marjorie's partial autobiography entitled "My Story".

To many people's astonishment, having assumed Marjorie was quintessentially English, we discov-

ered that she was in fact born in Dublin in 1935, where she spent a happy child-hood, although somewhat marred by the loss at the age of 5 of her young brother, Clifford. Her mother came from Eggington, and after Clifford's death, she and her grandmother both yearned to return to England, but this was wartime so they needed permission which was initially refused because of the Blitz. Then after D-Day, in which her father participated, Marjorie's mother re-visited the British Embassy, and this time permission was granted. Marjorie takes up the account of what she describes as "The Greatest Day In My Life" in May 1945:

Arrangements were made for us to travel on 10^{th} May – my Father was coming home to travel across with us. The house and furniture were sold, most of my toys were given to a little girl up the road. Our sole belongings were in three tea chests! Finding accommodation in London was very difficult — so much had been destroyed in the bombing. So unbelievably, the three of us joined an Aunt and Uncle with their four children in a 3-bed semi. Although I was excited coming to London, I was apprehensive about the sea journey and began to think they would have to leave me behind.

Then on 8th May a neighbour (whose husband was a Japanese P.O.W.) asked if my Mother had heard that the War had ended. I rushed inside and then we heard the church bells ring. That evening we went to a Thanksgiving Service, I wearing with pride a little red, white and blue ribbon brooch of my Mother's. I was on the way to being English!

And so the Great Day arrived. My Father came back the previous evening and we stayed overnight with an Aunt and Uncle. Still apprehensive, we travelled on the train to the Harbour where, concerningly, all passengers were handed a life jacket. My Mother and I had a cabin while my Father sat up on deck, and we set off on a very calm sea. Relief when we reached Holyhead.

And then the 6 hour train journey through the countryside, awash with flags and bunting — a sort of Royal Progression! An impressionable young girl thinking, could all this welcome be for us? Britain was in a state of euphoria at the end of the war in Europe and people were waving at the train and carrying flags all the way down to London. I was even more impressed with Euston Station which still had its Roman Arch outside — I had never seen such a magnificent building.

I slept well and woke to the noise of activity outside – people were already starting preparations for a street party the following day. Truly, this was a remarkable country!

That evening, as I sat on the garden wall watching the final preparations, I was aware of a stiff neck. I awoke next morning to find I had mumps – and missed the Party!

Just an insight into some of Marjorie's wonderful experiences in her early life, which she only began to share in her later years. Amazing to think that she never, ever revealed to anyone about her Irish roots, even when talking to someone who shared the same background.
