Letter from the St. Mary's Church

No doubt May 2023 will be remembered for a long time as Coronation month, and 2023 as a coronation year, but the greatest story of all time which we commemorate every year in April and through to May — the Holy Week and Easter story — reminds us of a coronation that begins with a mock crowning, very different from the magnificent ceremonial of the crowning of a British monarch. Jesus is unjustly condemned, ridiculed and crowned with a crown of thorns. This was a coronation that was not attended by honoured and respected guests, but by cruel and ruthless spectators who used this pretend coronation as a way of taunting Jesus, even putting up a sarcastic placard hailing the 'King of the Jews'.

Yet this event is turned upside down by what happens on Easter Day when Jesus rises from the dead and reappears to his disciples. He thereby demonstrates that he is truly divine, the Son of God, who has sacrificed himself so that we, all of us, can be reunited to God and so gain eternal life. He is therefore worthy to be worshipped and acknowledged as the King of Kings, who will reign for ever. As the well-known Hallelujah chorus from Handel's Messiah puts it:

King of kings! and Lord of lords! And He shall reign forever and ever Forever and ever Hallelujah! Hallelujah!

The Easter period this year continues right through to the end of May. In the middle end of this month, on Ascension Day (18th. May this year), we remember that Jesus ascends to heaven and takes his place as a divine King there, entrusting us at Pentecost (or Whitsun as it used to be called, 28th. May this year) the gift of the Holy Spirit which enables us to communicate with this King through prayer and worship and in all sorts of other ways.

So May is a great month, and not just because of the Easter and Pentecost story. This particular May, the four nations of the United Kingdom will also celebrate the coronation of a new King, and doubtless we will also enjoy the novelty of no fewer than three bank holidays!

As we do so, I hope it will be possible to take time to remember the people of the world who have very little to celebrate this month. Charities such as Christian Aid, whose week is 14-20 May, are particularly appealing for help for the victims of the earthquakes in Turkey and Syria, for support for people affected by armed conflict in Ukraine and Afghanistan, and food for innocent children, women and men in East Africa who face extreme hunger, caused by failed harvests and water shortages made worse by the Ukraine conflict.


Celebrating the King! plus HNH Good Neighbours

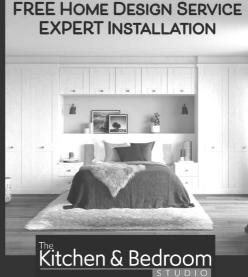

Marjorie Williams Part 2: The Harlington Years

Last month we learned that Marjorie came originally from Ireland and arrived in England on the day of celebrations in 1945 for the end of the war in Europe — but Marjorie thought all the celebrations were for her family's return to England!

After living in London, Marjorie's family eventually came to Harlington, moving into a brand new house in Foster Road. Marjorie lived there with her parents, and when they died inherited the house and so must be one of the few people who has lived in Foster Road since the houses were built in the 1960s. She was a commuter in the days of diesel trains, prior to



electrification, when missing a train might have meant an hour's delay. This was a comradely train with the Harlington club always sitting in the same carriage and becoming close friends. Marjorie had a high powered job as an administrator or personal secretary, ending her career as assistant to the Vice-Chancellor of City University (the picture is of her with the Vice-

Chancellor at the ceremony that confers graduates with their degrees). After retiring Marjorie threw herself into participating in local organisations which interested her. For many years she was a cub leader, taking the Leader name of Rikki (as in Rikki-Tikki Tavi from the Jungle Book — all leaders took Jungle Book names). Marjorie played tennis, badminton, and, later, table tennis. She always attended village barn dances. Marjorie was an enthusiastic member of Toddington Rambling Club, joining soon after the club started in 1980. She joined in as a leader for several walks, exploring new areas with lots of laughing and chatting, and pub lunches. Walking included group holidays in Freshwater, Isle of Wight, St. Ives in Cornwall and the Lake District. A few years ago she decided she preferred shorter walks, so joined Toddington U3A Strollers Group and Flitwick Health Walkers. And the accompanying pub lunches, of course.

Marjorie Williams ctd.

Marjorie pursued a number musical interests. She was a member of Luton and Toddington Music Clubs, the local U3A music group, and attended many concerts in Bedford and elsewhere, particularly enjoying opera and ballet at Milton Keynes and Dunstable theatres. She was secretary to the Harlington Festival committee in the 1980s. Apparently Marjorie would find out all she could about productions they were going to see at the theatre, about particular artists who would be taking part, and she would read all the critical reviews. She formed thoughtful and perceptive opinions that informed valued conversations during the interval and in the car going home. Yet it wasn't just music. Marjorie belonged to the Harlington Heritage Trust, the Harpenden Fine Arts Society and she ran the U3A Art Appreciation Group.

As to her character and wonderful qualities, here are some quotes of what people have said about her:

Marjorie she loved to tell a story, and did it so well. She had a fantastic sense of humour, and people described conversations dissolving into uncontrollable laughter. She had an ability to relate to everyone of all ages. In a nutshell, she was one of a kind. It has been an absolute privilege and an honour to have shared some special times with a truly remarkable lady.

I shall always remember as kind, cheerful, very knowledgeable, and very good company. I shall miss her friendship and smile.

She was always gracious, kind and generous with a friendly and relaxed and easy manner. She was a knowledgeable and interesting conversationalist, but also a good listener. If you had a problem she showed great empathy and would offer helpful advice. ... She will be greatly missed.

She was a wonderful friend, a gentle quite listening lady with a very strong faith.

On that last note, not only was Marjorie a regular member of St. Mary's Harlington congregation, she was also for a long time secretary to the St. Mary's Parochial Church Council, and highly respected for her faith and friendship. We will all miss her.
