Letter from the Life Church

A few weeks ago great fun was had during a car journey with two of our grand-children. They were both very tired and as it was late afternoon we were trying to keep them awake to avoid a nap so close to bedtime. We started singing loudly, any song we could remember much to the amusement of anyone who could hear or see us. During the journey we came across a series of traffic lights that drew the car to a stop and we waited for the lights to turn from red to green.

We had also came to a halt with the singing as our repertoire had come to an end. Suddenly a new song started to emerge involving red, yellow, green lights and stop, wait and go. From that moment every time we make a journey with the grandchildren and we encounter traffic lights the song is sung with great gusto and laughter.

Reflecting on this experience reminds me of when I pray. I love to spend time talking and listening to God our Heavenly Father, I will talk about my day and the challenges ahead, my family, friends, and anything that is on my mind. I will also listen and pray for his guidance.

How It All Began - Part 2

Summer of 1977 brought the Revd. Peter Stokes and his wife Margaret to Harlington. Having given them time to settle in I met with Peter and he enthusiastically agreed to speak to the Revd. D. Ford and members of the Christian Council (CTinH now) everyone agreed and so the work began.

We had a large team of people from both churches and it all seemed to work like clockwork. Articles were written, interviews given, reports from the organisations and the Lower School received.





The text was typed on my portable typewriter on A5 sheets which then went into the 'Blue Folder', passed to Kathy Webster who then typed up the pages on a

Roneo 'skin'. The skin was then put into the machine and the pages printed. The Roneo machine in the Vicarage was vintage, there was never a month when the printing was straightforward. We spent

many an hour coaxing and persuading the machine to print. I believe we even kicked it a few times! However in the end we managed to print the pages ready for collating.

A team of eight sat around the dining room table in the vicarage to collate all the pages. Margaret Stokes was known to be a wonderful baker and she kept the team going with her tea and cakes. I cannot remember all the team members but I do know Stella Inwards was there as we still reminisce occasionally. There was always a great deal of fun and laughter. When all was collated and in bundles according to roads, they were taken to the distributors, much as they are done today by Debbie Miles, after she receives them from the printers.

The first CONTACT magazine was free but we had to charge 5p a copy to cover our costs thereafter as our advertising was minimal. By the time we changed to being a free magazine we were charging 50p. The challenge of a second magazine in the village caused us to rethink how we would keep CONTACT going and we have survived. There are many people in the village associated with the magazine throughout the years including our current management team, who deserve our thanks that Contact is still in paper format and online today.

Harlington Lower & Sundon School Football Club

School's back and so are we! Football - more than most sports - provides kids of all ages with the chance to enjoy themselves, learn skills and make new friends. At HL&S FC we offer children an introduction to football, allowing them to have fun with their classmates whilst learning a new sport. Any child from reception class to year 4 (4-9 years) can join us for free on a Saturday morning at Harlington Lower School. We have mixed teams for each age



group and are growing our all-girl teams. As kids get older and progress through the club, they have the chance to play matches against other teams, helping them



develop an understanding of teamwork and improve communication skills and confidence.

The club is affiliated to the two village schools, but is not a school team, and accepts any children from the two villages, or local area. We are an FA-accredited club, run by volunteer parents, with fundraising events helping to cover running costs. All

the coaches and assistants are DBS-cleared and hold FA safeguarding and first aid qualifications. Several of the coaches have chosen to test themselves by qualifying as FA coaches, which allows the club to operate and compete in the county mini leagues. So, if your young player is interested, bring them along on

a Saturday, and the coaches will be only too happy to see you. Times for each year group will appear in the schools' newsletters for the first few weeks of the new term, but as a rule the sessions are 9-10am, and 10-11am. There's no need for new kit - we can provide pre-loved boots to allow players to see what they think before committing to a new pair. Any sports kit



is fine, and for those years that play league matches, team shirts and shorts will be provided.


We look forward to seeing lots of new players joining us on 9th September, with reception year following a couple of weeks later.

We have watched in awe and fascination as a doll's house was refurbished, and when the poppy wreaths from 2021 were re-purposed for Remembrance Sunday 2022.

We have inherited materials, and halffinished items, from friends and families, some of which have been completed, some

await completion (like this quilt), – and some of which have been pulled apart and the materials made available for re-use. Some of us have just one craft skill, and others like to try a variety of skills.

If you are interested in craft of any kind and would like to meet with like-minded people, or would like to try a new skill or refresh an older, underused one, please drop in to any meeting. If you would like to come, but find it difficult to get to the church, please let me know – we are still operating on Zoom as well as face to face. If you would like help with transport, again, please let me know, and I will try to arrange something.

Our September meetings will be 11^{th} , and 25^{th} on Zoom as well as in person, and refreshments are served at each meeting.



<u>Churchyard</u>: the Pyramidal Orchid is one of our commonest and most widespread wild orchids, but it was still lovely to see some flowering in the churchyard recently among the primrose plants. Unfortunately, the churchyard isn't the quiet oasis it normally is, with the stone masons on site, but I have to say they are doing a challenging job with cheerfulness and good humour. By the way, why did the rock go to jail?.....The quartz found him guilty!

South porch repairs and restoration: I know some folk who saw the uncovered stone work have expressed disappointment that it will eventually be hidden under new rendering – but this time the breathable kind thankfully. The original stone work consists of Ironstone and Totternhoe clunch, both of which 'weather' badly and tend to crumble and split. The safest and most cost effective way of making it secure and weatherproof is to use breathable rendering. It makes me wonder how long the original builders thought their handiwork would last! Did they think it would last for 850 years? We are so very grateful to the following charities who have awarded grants towards this work, (which will cost around £60,000); the Benefact Trust, the Francis Charitable Foundation and the Beds & Herts Historic Churches Trust.

<u>Social events: Harlington Manor Tour.</u> Many thanks to David Blakeman for kindly leading 2 guided tours of Harlington Manor in August, in aid of our Restoration Fund. The house has an absorbing history through the centuries, not least the association with John Bunyan, and David is very knowledgeable when explaining its fascinating history. Both tours were fully booked and I think the final raised will be over £500 which is amazing – thank you David.

<u>Gift Day 2023</u>: Saturday 9th September 10am-4pm. At the end of August, you'll receive a letter through your door explaining what our Gift Day is all about. The church will be open from 10am-4pm, with live organ music at various times, refreshments and home made cake, and different activities for children and families.
