Highlights for January



Highlights for January are Flitwick Rotary Cub cheque presentation evening where all charities who had collected at Tesco Flitwick or accompanied the Christmas float around the local towns and villages received a cheque for £150. The Rotarians decided to present a further £500 to a charity of their choosing and Brain Tumour Research was their chosen charity so £650 was banked and was very much appreciated and will help to fund a further 2 hours research. Thank you to Elliot for offering to water the charity plants during the summer months as part of his community service for his Duke of Edinburgh Award; this help will be very much appreciated and benefit the plants allowing me more time for stocking the stall, pricking out plants and setting additional seed trays, welcome aboard. The joy of Elliot offering to help, fired me up to tidy the plants and restock, which seemed to arouse an interest in the plants and this year £15.75 has been raised so far; it also started me planning what seeds to sow and I have decided on 4 varieties of tomatoes: Moneymaker, Tumbling, Gardeners' Delight and my favourite, Marmande, as well as courgettes, pumpkins, leeks, cabbage, cauliflower, runner beans, chillis, zinnias, marigolds, cosmos, wallflowers and love in a mist and anything else that takes my fancy. Thank you to John for supplying Aloe Vera houseplants currently being nurtured indoors but which will be available with the other houseplants at the end of May when frost free nights are guaranteed.

I have now booked our tour of the laboratory at Queen Mary University of London where Professor Silvia Marino and her team, in collaboration with University College London, are studying <u>glioblastoma multiforme (GBM)</u> brain tumours, (this is the Brain tumour Pete, my sister Anne and cousin Peter suffered) the most aggressive and most common primary high-grade tumour diagnosed in adults, as well as some rarer primarily childhood tumours such as choroid plexus.

The team are aiming to establish the difference between tumour stem cells, which help drive uncontrolled tumour growth, and normal brain stem cells, which stop dividing once they naturally evolve into specialised brain cells. With this knowledge, the team can identify new and/or existing drugs that can halt or slow down the rapid spread of these invasive types of brain tumour, whilst also potentially reducing the side effects of existing chemotherapy treatments. This is where we will also place the tiles in memory of Pete, Anne and Peter on



Going Like the Clappers - the 1907/8 Sharpenhoe Speed Motor Hill Climbs



In the early days of motoring, hill climb competitions were very popular. Originally, the challenge was simply to get up the steepest of hills but, as the climbing ability of vehicles improved, the challenge changed to see who could go up the fastest. This is the story of a series of speed events, mainly for motorcycles, held on Sharpenhoe Hill, near Barton-le-Clay, during 1907 and 1908. Now largely forgotten, the events were hugely popular and attracted large crowds and some of the top riders and drivers of the day.
