We can liken our move through life as pilgrims on a journey, and as we walk together, we share our stories and help each other as we journey on.

## **Mr Peter Davies**

We sadly lost Peter who passed on the 20th April 2024.

Peter was born in July 1942 in Swansea, Wales, one of 4 brothers born to Stan and Dorothy Davies

He was married for over 60 years to his beloved wife Bronwen having met when they were teenagers in Swansea 66 years ago. They were married on his 21st birthday at St Peters church in the parish of Crockett, Swansea by Fred Secombe – Harry Secombe's brother no less. A little claim to celebrity status!

He spent his early years in Swansea working in what was the GPO as a dispatch rider, sales counter clerk, and manager. Following a promotion to BT in London he moved in the early seventies to Leagrave, making a difficult decision to move away from family in Wales with Bronwen and three small children. Buying a house without his wife even seeing it, He was obviously a brave man. In 1976 the family moved to Harlington and lived in the village ever since.

He worked at BT for many years and in numerous roles making many lifelong friends eventually retiring from BT at the early age of 48. Retirement however was short-lived as he took on the role of Library Manager at Toddington library, a job he loved and where he stayed until he retired again at 65!

His passing showed to us his family how much he was liked and well regarded in the village and the local community, and many people who he grew up with and worked with made long journeys to attend his funeral on 22nd May.

Peter and Maisie his beloved Maltipoo were seen as minor celebrities in Harlington village often chatting and talking to people as they went on walks around the village. He will be sorely missed and fondly remembered by many as a true gentleman of the village.

We would like to thank everyone that attended the funeral service and the wake. It was comforting to see so many family and friends in attendance in what was a lovely celebration of his life.

Peter was a devoted husband and father, a loving family man, and a great friend. He leaves a hole in all our hearts that will never be filled but he will be remembered every day.

June has been busy particularly when we had our hot week, busy trying to keep things

watered that is! I managed to empty all 4 of my water butts; panic set in as my watering system in the garden was failing me and I am not keen on using mains water knowing all plants thrive better on rain water. So after watering one night and feeling drained and exhausted I indulged in a nice soaky bath during which I had a thought if I save the water overnight it will be cooled then in the morning shower over the top of this, then bale it out and water all the plants and vegetable patch which I did but it took about 2 hours and then I felt hot and sticky from all the to-ing and fro-ing but it was a good feeling not to be wasting water!! I would like to make a special mention and thank you to David for helping me to sort out the watering system which will be my back up if that heatwave ever returns!

It was a good month fundraising with £622.50 raised on plants and items from outside my house and £129.50 from sales of plants at Brain Tumour Research Headquarters in Milton Keynes.

I have received some super donations of perennials, vegetable plants, trees and beautiful pots (these don't hang about, so if you need any ceramic pots keep visiting and don't miss out) Thank you to all those people who have donated; I don't always get to see you to thank you or indeed know who has delivered but please know it is very much appreciated. I do know and want to thank Duncan for his donation of 8 bags of home made compost. That was a huge help and has saved me from buying even more compost, I have bought about 11 bags to date so almost 20 bags including Duncan's, BIG BIG thank you! Also thanks to Jim and Sandra who are delivering regularly bags of Redcurrants and Blackcurrants they have been stored in my coolbox outside my house for the last 3 weeks and have been well received by the jam/jelly makers in the village, thank you.

And now the complete opposite JULY and it really couldn't be much wetter. I am not complaining as my water butts are full again and I have only had to water a few things as everything out in the open is swimming and I am having to find pots to decant this water into, such extremes. Does this mean we are going to have proper sunny summer holidays for our school children? It would be so nice if it was. The mixture of the heat from the very hot week and now the rain has made all our vegetables green up and fatten up, tomatoes are looking good and courgettes and cucumbers are also producing their fruits; that is if the slugs haven't got them first. It has been a big battle getting the plants to this stage and some poor folk having to replant 2 and 3 times before seeing success.

July has also seen generous individual donations to the charity, thank you; a

and I would like to say a very BIG thank you to the 7 families or individuals who braved the outdoors and came to support where £42 was raised, that was very generous of you all;.

I will be reporting next month on the table top sale organised by Friends of Harlington Lower School and our visit to the Queen Mary lab tour taking place on 10th July, where we will meet Dr Silvia Marino who will explain her work. We will have a tour of the labs and then visit the wall of hope

where we will place the plaques in memory of Pete, each plaque represents £2740 raised for the charity and will fund a days research we will be placing 10 plaques on the wall and you have helped us to achieve this. Thankyou.

Finally thank you to Elliot who has worked tirelessly on Sunday afternoons sowing seeds, potting on, watering, weeding, to create the immense display outside 132 Goswell End Road. I have had a number of people comment on the array and variety of plants available and it has been a bumper fundraising season as a result. Elliot also set up a community group called Jane's plants where we will be posting any interesting plants, pots, tools, available fruit and/or veg that arrive, so that you will be the first to know. So if you wish to join the community go to Communities and find Jane's plants. Elliot will allow you in and you can be the first to know. He is also going to help me for a couple of Sundays in July and August but I would publicly like to recognise the contribution he has made to the charity, his dedication to his community service towards his Duke of Edinburgh Award and the lovely conversations we have had whilst working in the cold, wind, rain and sun, on a couple of occasions, whilst gardening. It has been great to have your help, Elliot, and I thank you very much.

To you all thank you and I hope to see you at either the Methodists coffee morning on the last Saturday of each month 10-12 noon or at the Flower and Vegetable Show on 24th August. 

Many readers may remember the McDouall family. Alan, Jenny, Alec and Mowenna, residents of Harlington between 1974 and 1998.

Jenny, a Laboratory Technician in Leeds Hospital before she married and an amateur artist was an active member of the Christian community in the village and I well remember her amazing sewing talents when we produced a children's musical called 'The Burning Bush' at the Upper School in 1981.

Jenny will be remembered as 'The Lollipop Lady' along with her friend Joan during the 1980s. Later she took a Degree Course at the London Bible College and went on to teach ESOL courses in Bedford.
