Letter from the Life Church

In May, as a family, we went on holiday to the Isle of Wight. While sitting outside enjoying a drink one evening, watching the sunset, our eyes were drawn to a lighthouse flashing its warning of the danger in the waters of the Solent to craft both little and large.

On trips around the island we also saw the famous lighthouse at The Needles. Sadly over the past few years they are no longer manned and their number has declined due



to the cost of maintenance and the advent of much cheaper, more sophisticated and more effective electronic navigational systems. I found seeing the light was reassuring though, knowing that it was guiding sailors to avoid having any major disasters.

The role of a lighthouse is highlighted in a true story of a young lady called Grace Darling and a shipwreck of a paddle steamer called SS Forfarshire. It was sailing from Hull to Dundee when the ship got caught in a storm and was pushed south towards the Farne Islands where, at around 4.30am, the Forfarshire hit the Big Harcar rock, breaking it into two. Grace and her parents were in the Langstone Lighthouse and they saw movement on the rocks at around 7 o'clock in the morning. Grace and her father rowed out in the storm to the rocks to rescue the people, as there were too many to fit in the boat Grace's father jumped onto the rock and left Grace trying to keep the boat steady, while her father put some of the survivors into the boat. They then returned back to the lighthouse where Grace and her mother started to care for the survivors, her father returned to rescue the remaining people.

In the recent years a song called My Lighthouse by Rend Collective has become very popular and often sung during times of worship. It has lots of actions and it's enjoyed by both young and old. It's main theme is that God is a beacon of light, a fortress that defends, protects and rescues us from our own doubts.

As Christians, we are encouraged to keep our eyes focused on God, in his word we are reminded that he is the light of the world, a place of refuge and strength. As the lighthouse shines it lights across the water, guiding the ships on their journey.

God will guide us through our life journey. In the story of Grace, she took the survivors back to the lighthouse to nurse and restore them to health. Life showers us all with lots of different challenges and times where we feel we have no strength or ability to continue. God is there and as the song says, "he is our peace in the troubled sea".

Brain Tumour Research



A report on our visit to a centre of excellence where research into a cure for Glioblastoma brain tumours is underway.



On 10th July my daughter Emma and my sister in law, Sue and I were invited to the Brain Tumour Research centre of excellence at Queen Mary University of London to find out how our fundraising is helping support scientists leading the way in research into Glioblastoma GBS brain tumours.

We were given the opportunity to tour the labs at Queen Mary University of London, led by principal investigator Professor Silvia Marino. We spoke to scientists about their work to find a cure for the disease and placed 11 tiles on the Wall of Hope in Pete's memory.

What an amazing day. I didn't know what to expect but I wasn't expecting to be in such an amazing building with such incredible scientists, celebrating our fundraising efforts, and sharing the same sense of loss with so many other families.

To date we have raised in excess of £42,000. This allowed us to add 11 tiles in



memory of Pete on the wall of hope. For every £2740 raised a tile can be placed on the wall of hope.

It was a privilege hearing from the researchers and the incredible work that they do, how far they have come and some of the thinking behind what they do. Being present in that inspirational building where this all takes place felt monumental.

Seeing the wall of hope makes you realise how many lives are touched and

affected by this awful disease and knowing some of the pain those families are feeling.

We enjoyed tea and cakes during the presentation as we sat in the neuron pod (see picture opposite).

It was an opportunity to take time to reflect, consider and "be" in the environment of the work that will take us closer to a cure from this dreadful disease.

It allowed us as a family to focus on Pete, our journey, and to give credit to our fundraising and hope on what we want to achieve by it. It was a very worthwhile day which has provided some sense of healing, knowledge and a feeling of community as those affected are collectively gathered under one amazing roof, with those who are organising the funding for the research, BTR, and those who are enabling progress to achieve our motives, to find a cure.

We would like to take this opportunity to thank you all for making this day of reflection, celebration and unity possible, and for supporting our efforts to make a difference to those who suffer from a brain tumour and their families living with the loss. Your continued love and support brings us hope, joy and confidence that we are one day going to reach our goal to find a cure. To this end we thank you for helping us to reach our current total of £1693.84 for plants, produce and gardening sundries this year from my front garden. It is a fairly certain prediction that we will break the record of £1700 recorded last year. I also plan to have a garage sale at the end of September to raise further funds for the charity, please look out for posters, and also hold a coffee morning in November as in previous years to launch and sell this year's Christmas card collection for Brain Tumour Research. I do hope to see you at one or both of these events.



Commonwealth War Graves

Recently the Commonwealth War Graves Commission replaced the headstone of Able Seaman N. Jeffrey in the Barton Road side of the cemetery.





Able Seaman Norman Jeffrey.

'Merchant Navy. S.S.. Dartmouth Park, (Montreal) 21st August age 35, Son of Alexander and Ethel E Jeffrey, husband of Susan Jeffrey. Susan was a teacher at the village school. Norman came from Barton and died of consumption. They lived at the top of Sundon Road beside Jimmy's shop. (Now Number 2?), later living in Wingate Road. They had two sons, Colin and Bruce. His wife survived him. S.S. Dartmouth Park was originally launched in Canada as Camp Sussex in 1943. Harlington Divided Cemetery. Barton Road. Left of gate entrance. Plot 91. Church of England. Common-

wealth War Grave.' (Information from November 2019 exhibition in the Parish Hall.)

I asked Steve Peck, the guy doing the job, why he was replacing the headstone, he shrugged and replied 'I'm just doing my job.' I then asked what was the criteria for a Commonwealth War Grave? With a cheeky grin he pulled from the van dash a doubled sided sheet which I was able to copy at the Estate Agents. The list contains about 40 categories, for example, Boston & Spalding Pilotage Authority, War Correspondents 3rd Sept 39 to 15 Aug 45, or Friends War Victims Relief Committee (Quakers), to name but a few.



We have three Commonwealth headstones in the cemetery. They are all different. The three Graves are; the above, Leslie George Kent, north of top path. George Stone, in west part. Further information:




