A letter from St. Mary's Church

Dear Friends,

Although this is the April edition of the magazine, I am beginning to write this letter whilst still in the first week of March. As the editor will tell you, printing deadlines mean that preparation of the content of the magazine does need to be made a few weeks in advance of the publication release date. As I write it is also the beginning of Lent. And during the time of Lent there is much about preparation. For the church, Lent is a time of preparation for Easter. A time when the church prepares for the celebration of the death and resurrection of Jesus. Easter Day was also a time in the early church when new Christians were baptised, and the season of Lent was a time of preparation for those to be baptised.

This year, Easter falls in April, and is perhaps the most important Christian festival, for the message of Easter is the foundation of the Christian faith. We look to the cross on Good Friday where Jesus died for us, taking upon himself the sins of the whole world. But we look also to Easter morning and to the empty tomb. Yes, Jesus died, but he rose again. And it is his resurrection from the dead that enables us to live in hope. It was the resurrection that transformed Jesus' disciples, who were empowered to spread the message of Jesus Christ across the world.

Throughout the world, Christians today celebrate the awesome power of God as Jesus calls us all out of the darkness and into his marvellous light. When we look at the state of the world today it certainly does appear that we are in times of darkness. We do need to see some light, and we are all looking for that flicker of hope.

During Lent Christians are encouraged to grow in our faith by giving greater attention to prayer, study and in reading the Bible. It is a time, as I mentioned above, to prepare for Easter. But as we take the time to prepare for what is to come, we also take time to reflect on what has passed. We look back and reflect on all that God has done for us and see how he has directed us in our journey of faith. Life might not always be easy, but God is always there for us. We are not alone on our journey. And knowing this helps us as we look ahead into the future. As we come towards Easter, we are reminded that there is hope. And that hope is in Jesus Christ, our Saviour, who died for us and rose again.

May God's blessing be upon you all.

- Putting responsibility on the Government to review the Orphan Drug Regulations, with respect to rare cancer patients
- Ensuring that patients can be easily contacted about relevant research and clinical trials



For those who don't know, from 4 pm we have activities, including painting, cooking, model making or similar, then at 4.45 pm we go into our celebration, with stories, songs and some more activities. While we're doing that, someone else is setting out tea, which we have from 5.30 pm to 6 pm.

We have a Zoom link for those who can't get to the chapel, and livestream the celebration to YouTube, which also provides a recording. Don't forget, while children need an adult, Messy Church is not just for children. If you find that making things helps with the Bible stories, Messy Church may be for you.


